

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## **Executive Summary**

The University of New Hampshire Survey Center, in conjunction with the healthy Monadnock Alliance, conducted the 2024 Greater Monadnock Community Survey to better understand the Monadnock community's health concerns and quality of life. Monadnock region residents received two letters inviting them to complete the survey online, along with a postcard reminder. Overall, 533 respondents completed the survey between March 28 and June 3rd, 2024.

The following figures display survey results for each question. Appendix A contains detailed tabular results, Appendix B contains the open-ended responses, and Appendix C contains the survey instrument. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.

#### **Key Findings**

#### Demographics

Respondents are most likely to report residing in Keene, Peterborough, Chesterfield, Swanzey, and Jaffrey. When asked to rate their financial situation a scale from 0-10, a quarter give a rating of 0-4, nearly half give a rating of 5-7, and a quarter give a rating of 8-10.

#### **Health Status and Healthcare Access**

A majority of respondents rate their overall health as good and only one in twenty rate it as poor or very poor. Those from less wealthy households are less likely to rate their overall health highly. Close to half of respondents report at least 1 day in the past 30 in which poor physical health kept them from their usual activities, and three in ten say the same about their mental health.

About one in six each say that at least once in the past 12 months they were unable to get care for a sickness or illness or have a routine medical visit. Those with low incomes are particularly likely to say this has happened to them. Both groups are most likely to cite being unable to get an appointment scheduled in a reasonable time as a reason they were unable to get the care they needed. Healthcare professionals, the internet, and family members, friends, and co-workers are the most popular sources of health information among respondents.

Just under a quarter of respondents are currently providing care or assistance to someone in need. Those who are doing so most often report doing physical tasks such as cleaning the home and going shopping. Nearly half provide care or assistance once a day or more often and a majority say that it adds a lot or some to their personal levels of stress.

#### **Food Access and Active Living**

Most respondents find it very or somewhat easy to buy healthy foods like fresh fruits or vegetables. Those who feel it is difficult by far most often cite the cost of healthy foods as an impediment. A majority say that at least rarely they are unable to buy the kind of food they wanted because it was too expensive and nearly one in five say that this is always or often the case. One-third say that at least rarely they cannot afford to eat balanced meals and one in five at least rarely cut the size or skip meals because there was not enough food. Those with lower levels of income and education are more likely to report these situations happening to them over the past 12 months. More than half of respondents say that they exercise vigorously 3 times a week or more often, particularly older people, men, and those with good financial situations, while those with poor financial situations and women are less likely to exercise this often.

#### **Transportation**

The vast majority of respondents have a functioning and legal personal motor vehicle and very few say that a lack of transportation prevents them from activities or accessing services. Those with lower incomes and renters are more likely than others to lack personal transportation and to be limited by a lack of transportation.

#### Mental Health

Nearly two-thirds of respondents feel that they definitely have someone to support them in the case of an emergency, and nearly all the rest say they probably have such a person. Clear majorities know of entities or organizations to contact if they are in need of help regarding mental health, substance abuse, or aging issues, while smaller majorities are aware of resources for help with children or adolescents or if they are facing financial difficulties. A plurality agree that people often use mental health as an excuse to get out of tough situations, particularly registered Republicans and young people. However, a majority would not try to conceal receiving mental health treatment from friends and family and disagree that people worry too much about their mental health and do not need mental health treatment unless they have serious issues.

#### **Community Safety and Connection**

A majority of respondents feel a sense of community with others in their hometown while only one in five disagree. Nine in ten feel very or somewhat safe in public spaces during the day, particularly those with higher incomes and levels of education. Relatively few young people, those with low incomes, and those with a high school education or less feel this way. Overall, most respondents rate their hometown as a very good or good place to live, particularly those in good financial situations.

#### **Emergency Preparedness and Resiliency**


In the event of a catastrophic disaster, a majority of respondents feel that emergency responders would get to them within several hours or sooner. About one-third say that their household has a complete emergency preparedness kit while half have an partially complete kit and one in six have no emergency preparedness kit at all. Large majorities of respondents feel that they tend to bounce back after personal hardships, are able to adapt when changes occur, and can deal efficiently with unexpected events.

#### **Demographics**

NOTE: This survey data is weighted to latest American Community Survey (ACS) estimates from the U.S. Census Bureau by age, level of education, and gender. The data is also weighted by party registration based on the latest registration numbers provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State.


Twenty-four percent of respondents are between the ages of 18 and 34, 19% are between the ages of 35 and 49, 29% are between the ages of 50 and 64, and 27% are 65 or older.

Figure 1: Age of Respondent




Forty-eight percent of respondents identify as women and 48% identify as men. One percent of respondents identify as a transgender man, 1% identify as genderqueer or gender-nonconforming, and 2% prefer not to say.

Figure 2: Gender of Respondent




One-third of respondents (32%) say a high school degree is the highest level of education they have achieved with another 2% saying they have some high school education but not a diploma. Nearly three in ten (29%) have attended technical school (6%) or have some college education (23%) while 22% are college graduates and 16% have completed postgraduate work.

Figure 3: Highest Level of Education Completed by Respondent




One in five respondents (20%) say that they are the only adult in their household, 61% are in a household with two adults, 10% are in a household with three adults, and 8% are an in household with four or more adults.

Figure 4: Number of Adults in Household




Seven in ten respondents (70%) say that there are no children in their household, 13% have one child in their household, 10% have two children in their household, and 7% have three or more children in their household.

Figure 5: Number of Children in Household




Just under one in five respondents (18%) say that they or someone else in their household is a veteran of the armed forces, while 82% say no one in their household is a veteran.

Figure 6: Veteran Household




Four in five respondents (79%) say that they own their home, 16% rent their home, and 5% have a different living arrangement.

Figure 7: Own or Rent Home




A large majority of respondents (85%) say that their sexual identity is straight or heterosexual, 5% identify as bisexual, 2% identify as queer, pansexual, or questioning, while 1% identify as lesbian or gay. Two percent say their sexual identity is something else while 4% prefer not to say.

Figure 8: Sexual Identity of Respondent




More than nine in ten respondents (92%) identify as Caucasian or White, 3% identify as African American, Black, or Caribbean American, 3% identify as Native American, Inuit, or Aleut, 2% identify as Asian American or Pacific Islander, and 1% identify as Latin or Hispanic. One percent of respondents identify as another race or ethnicity while 4% prefer not to say.

Figure 9: Race/Ethnicity of Respondent (Select all that apply)




Eleven percent of respondents say that their household income is less than \$30,000 while 17% say their household income is between \$30,000 and \$59,999. One-quarter of respondents (25%) have a household income between \$60,000 and \$99,999 while nearly one-third (31%) have a household income of \$100,000 or more. Four percent of respondents say they don't know what their household income is while 12% prefer not to say.

Figure 10: Household Income




When asked to rate their financial condition on a scale of 0 to 10, with 10 representing the best possible financial condition and 0 representing the worst, one-quarter of respondents rated their financial condition with a 0 (2%), 1 (1%), 2 (5%), 3 (8%), or 4 (9%). Just under half (47%) rated their financial condition with a 5 (17%), 6 (12%), or 7 (18%) while one-quarter (27%) rated their financial condition with a 8 (14%), 9 (9%), or 10 (4%).

Figure 11: Rating of Financial Condition




Two in five respondents (39%) say they are employed full-time while 8% are employed part-time and 6% are self-employed. Thirty-one percent of respondents are retired, 5% are unemployed, 9% are homemakers, and 1% are students.

One-third of respondents (33%) are Registered Democrats while a similar amount are Registered Undeclareds (34%). One-quarter of respondents (24%) are Registered Republicans, 6% are not registered to vote, and 2% are not sure of their voter registration status.

Figure 14: Respondent's City/Town of Residence




Figure 15: Demographics By Region


Figure 16: Demographics By Region

#### **Health Status and Healthcare Access**


One in five respondents (19%) rate their overall health as very good while a majority (56%) rate their health as good. Twenty percent rate their health as fair, 3% rate it as poor, and 2% rate it as very poor.

Figure 17a: In general, how would you rate your overall health?




• Respondents with a household income of \$150,000 or more, those who rate their financial situation between 8 and 10, and those who have completed postgraduate work are more likely than others to rate their overall health as very good or good. Respondents who rent their home, those with a household income of less than \$30,000, those who rate their financial situation between 0 and 4, and those who attended technical school or have some college education are less likely to rate their overall health as very good or good.

Figure 17b: Rate overall health as very good or good - By Select Demographics




Just over half of respondents (56%) say that were no days in the past 30 when poor physical health kept them from doing their usual activities, such as self-care, work, or recreation. Eight percent say this was the case 1 day in the past 30, 11% say there were 2 days, 9% say there were between 3 and 5 days, and 17% say this was the case for more than 5 days.

Figure 18a: For about how many days during the past 30 days did poor physical health keep you from doing your usual activities, such as self-care, work, or recreation?




• Respondents who have a veteran in their household, those who rate their financial situation between 8 and 10, those with a household income of \$150,000 or more, and those who are college graduates or have more education are more likely than others to say their were no days in the past 30 in which poor physical health kept them from doing usual activities. Those with a household income less than \$30,000, those who rate their financial situation between 0 and 4, those who rent their home, and those between the ages of 35 and 49 are less likely than others to say this is the case.

Seven in ten respondents (70%) say that were no days in the past 30 when poor mental health kept them from doing their usual activities, such as self-care, work, or recreation. Four percent say this was the case 1 day in the past 30, 7% say there were 2 days, 10% say there were between 3 and 5 days, and 9% say this was the case for more than 5 days.


Figure 19a: For about how many days during the past 30 days did poor mental health keep you from doing your usual activities, such as self-care, work, or recreation?


Figure 19b: How many in past 30 days did poor mental health keep from doing usual activities, such as self-care, work, or recreation - By Select Demographics


Fifteen percent of respondents say that in the past 12 months, they or another adult in their household needed or wanted medical care for a sickness or illness, 81% say this did not happen in the past 12 months, and 3% don't know or can't remember. Sixteen percent of respondents say that in the past 12 months, they or another adult in their household needed or wanted a routine physical exam or checkup, 83% say this did not happen in the past 12 months, and 1% don't know or can't remember.

- Respondents with a household income of less than \$30,000, those who rate their financial situation between 0 and 4, and those who rent their home are more likely than others to say that there was a time in the past 12 months when they or someone in their household needed or wanted medical care for a sickness or illness but did not or could not get it. Those with a household income of \$150,000 or more are less likely than others to say this was the case.
- Respondents with two or more children in their household, those with a household income between \$75,000 and \$99,999 or less than \$30,000, Registered Republicans, and those who rate their financial situation between 0 and 4 are more likely than others to say that there was a time in the past 12 months when they or someone in their household needed or wanted a routine physical exam or checkup but did not or could not get it. 
Figure 20b: Needed or wanted medical care for the following reasons but did not or could not get care - By Select Demographics



Respondents are slightly less likely than in 2020 but slightly more likely than in 2017 to say there was a time in the past 12 months where they or another adult in their household needed or wanted medical care for a routine physical exam or checkup or for a sickness or illness.

Among respondents who said they or someone in their household needed or wanted medical care in the last 12 months for a sickness or illness but did not or could not get care, 42% say this happened 1 time, 23% say it happened 2 times, 7% say it happened 3 times, 2% say it happened 4 times, 9% say it happened 5 times, and 16% say it happened more than 5 times. Among respondents who said they or someone in their household needed or wanted a routine physical exam or checkup in the last 12 months but did not or could not get it, 41% say this happened 1 time, 34% say it happened 2 times, 15% say it happened 3 times, 6% say it happened 4 times, 4% say it happened 5 times, and 1% say it happened more than 5 times.

Figure 21a: How many times in the past 12 months have you or another adult in your household needed or wanted medical care for the following reasons but did not or could not get care for any reason?






Figure 21b: How many times in the past 12 months have you or another adult in your household needed or wanted medical care for the following reasons but did not or could not get care for any reason? - By Year




Respondents who were unable to or did not receive medical care for a sickness or illness were most likely to mention not getting an appointment scheduled in a reasonable time (43%), a lack of insurance making it too expensive (25%), or not being able to afford a co-pay or out-of-pocket costs even with insurance (22%) as reasons why. Respondents who were unable to or did not receive a routine physical exam or checkup were most likely to mention not getting an appointment scheduled in a reasonable time (43%), not having a primary care provider or place where they usually get care (31%), not being able to get an appointment without a referral (27%), and not knowing where to go or who to call for help (22%) as reasons why.

Figure 22: Why were you unable or did not receive care for... (Select all that apply)




More than four in five respondents (83%) say that healthcare professionals are the source of health information they used the most often (49%), second most often (20%), or third most often (13%) in the past 12 months. Three in four (76%) say that they use the internet or websites as a top three source of health information for themselves while half (51%) say the same about family members, friends, or co-workers. One-quarter of respondents (24%) say that pharmacists are a top three source of health information for them in the past year while fewer respondents say the same about print materials (11%), social media (9%), podcasts (8%), online magazines or newspapers (7%), television or radio (3%), or a public or community outreach event (1%).

Figure 23a: In the past 12 months, which of the following are the three sources you have used most often as a source of health information for yourself?





Figure 23b: Three sources used most often as a source of health information - By Select Demographics Healthcare professionals




- Respondents with a household income between \$60,000 and \$74,999, those aged 18 to 34, those with two or more children in their household, and those who are employed full-time are more likely than others to say family members, friends, or co-workers are one of their top three sources of health information. Respondents who rent their home, those who rate their financial situation between 8 and 10, those who are retired, and those with a household income of less than \$30,000 are less likely to say this.
- Respondents with a household income of less than \$30,000 are more likely than others to say pharmacists are one of their top three sources of health information. Those with a household income of \$150,000 or more are less likely to say this.
- Respondents who are retired and those who rate their financial situation between 8 and 10 are more likely than others to say print materials are one of their top three sources of health information. Those aged 18 to 34 and those with two or more children in their household are less likely to say this.
- Respondents with a household income less than \$30,000 are more likely than others to say social media is one of their top three sources of health information.
- Respondents aged 35 to 49 and those with a household income between \$100,000 and \$149,999 are more likely than others to say podcasts are one of their top three sources of health information.

Figure 23c: Three sources used most often as a source of health information - By Select Demographics Family members, friends, or co-workers




Respondents are more likely than in previous years to say that healthcare professionals, the internet or websites, and pharmacists are one of three sources of health information that they use most often. Respondents are less likely than in previous years to say print materials or television or radio are one of their top three sources.

Just under one-quarter of respondents (23%) say that they currently provide care or assistance to a friend or family member who is aging, has a health problem, or has a disability, while 77% do not currently provide this care.


Figure 24a: Do you currently provide care or assistance to a friend or family member who is aging, has a health problem, or has a disability?


Figure 24b: Currently provide care or assistance to a friend or family member who is aging, has a health problem, or has a disability - By Select Demographics


Among respondents who say that they currently provide care or assistance to a friend or family member who is aging, has a health problem, or has a disability (N=120), nearly two-thirds (64%) say that they do physical tasks such as cleaning the home as the type of care or assistance they provide, while smaller majorities go shopping (59%), assist with paperwork or documentation (55%), help with medical decisions (53%), or provide transportation (52%). Forty-three percent of respondents help pay for expenses as part of care or assistance they provide while 28% provide companionship or social interaction, 27% help dress or feed, and 23% provide some other type of care or assistance.

Figure 25: What kind of things do you typically do to provide care or assist your family member or friend who is aging, has a health problem, or has a disability?




Among respondents who say that they currently provide care or assistance to a friend or family member who is aging, has a health problem, or has a disability, one-third (34%) say they provide this care or assistance more than once a day while another 10% provide it about once a day. Twenty-three percent provide this care or assistance a few times a week, 25% provide it a few times a month, and 7% provide it every few months.

Among respondents who say that they currently provide care or assistance to a friend or family member who is aging, has a health problem, or has a disability, three in four respondents (74%) say that providing this care or assistance adds a lot (39%) or some (35%) to their personal levels of stress, while only 15% say this adds not very much to their personal levels of stress and 12% say this doesn't add to it at all.


Figure 26b: How much, if it all, does providing care or assistance to a friend or family member who is aging, has a health problem, or has a disability add to your personal levels of stress?



#### **Food Access and Active Living**

Thirty-five percent of respondents say that they exercise in a way that causes some increase in breathing or heart rate for at least 20 minutes more than 3 times a week, 17% do so about 3 times a week, 21% do so 1-2 times a week, 16% do this less than once a week, 11% never exercise in this way, and 1% don't know or are unsure.


Figure 27a: In a typical week, how often do you exercise in a way that causes some increase in breathing or heart rate for at least 20 minutes?



• Respondents who are retired, those with a household income of \$150,000 or more or between \$30,000 and \$59,999, men, those who rate their financial situation between 8 and 10, and those aged 65 and older are more likely than others to say they exercise in a way that causes some increase in breathing or heart rate for at least 20 minutes about 3 times a week or more often. 
Figure 27b: In a typical week, how often do you exercise in a way that causes some increase in breathing or heart rate for at least 20 minutes - By Select Demographics




Figure 28a: How easy or difficult is it for you to buy healthy foods like fresh fruits or vegetables?


Figure 28b: How easy or difficult is it for you to buy healthy foods like fresh fruits or vegetables - By Select Demographics



Figure 28c: How easy or difficult is it for you to buy healthy foods like fresh fruits or vegetables - By Year





Figure 29: Why would you say that it is difficult for you to buy healthy foods like fresh fruits and vegetables? (Please select all that apply)





Figure 30a: How often did the following things happen for anyone in your household over the past 12 months?



Figure 30b: Happen for anyone in your household over the past 12 months - By Select Demographics Couldn't buy the kind of food you wanted because it was too expensive




Figure 30c: Happen for anyone in your household over the past 12 months - By Select Demographics Cut the size or skipped meals because there wasn't enough food


Figure 31a: Which of the following best describes your current situation regarding a personal motor vehicle (i.e. car, truck, or motorcycle)?


Figure 31b: Best describes your current situation regarding a personal motor vehicle - By Select Demographics


Figure 32a: Does a lack of transportation ever prevent you from doing the following things? (Please select all that apply)


Figure 32b: Does a lack of transportation ever prevent you from doing the following things? (Please select all that apply)- By Select Demographics


Figure 32c: Does a lack of transportation ever prevent you from doing the following things? (Please select all that apply) - By Year


Figure 33a: If something unexpected happened, like an emergency, do you have someone in your life who you could count on to support you?


Figure 33b: If something unexpected happened, like an emergency, do you have someone in your life who you could count on to support you - By Select Demographics




Figure 34b: Agree with following statements about mental health - By Select Demographics People today often use mental health as an excuse to get out of tough situations




Figure 35a: If you needed help with the following situations, would you know an entity or organization where you could go to get help?

Figure 35b: Definitely or probably would know an entity or organization where you could go to get help with the following situations - By Select Demographics



Figure 35c: Definitely or probably would know an entity or organization where you could go to get help with the following situations - By Select Demographics








Figure 36a: How safe do you feel out in public spaces, such as parks, sidewalks, or trails during the day?


Figure 36b: How safe do you feel out in public spaces, such as parks, sidewalks, or trails during the day? - By Select Demographics


Figure 37a: Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: I feel a sense of community with others in my town or city


Figure 37b: Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: I feel a sense of community with others in my town or city - By Select Demographics



Figure 37c: Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: I feel a sense of community with others in my town or city - By Year





Figure 38a: Overall, how would you rate your community as a place to live?






Figure 38c: Overall, how would you rate your community as a place to live? - By Year



Figure 39a: Imagine that there is a catastrophic disaster event that affects your entire community. How long do you believe it will take for an emergency responder to get to you?








Figure 40a: Does your household have an emergency kit that would allow you to shelter in place for 3 days, including the following items: at least two days of food and water, a flashlight, a portable radio and spare batteries, emergency phone numbers, and a meeting place for family members in case of evacuation?


Figure 40b: Does your household have an emergency kit that would allow you to shelter in place for 3 days, including the following items: at least two days of food and water, a flashlight, a portable radio and spare batteries, emergency phone numbers, and a meeting place for family members in case of evacuation? - By Select Demographics








Figure 41a: Below, please indicate whether you agree or disagree with the following statements






